Title Godstone/Tandridge Circular Walk

Date: Saturday 6th September 2025 Note: date change

Time: Meet 10.15 am – Leaving Godstone at 10.30

Meeting Point: Godstone Green Car Park, Opposite the White Hart, Godstone RH9 8DU.

Please note that there are two small car parks adjacent to the Pond on Godstone Green (no charge). These can get busy, but there is additional parking on Ivy Mill Lane on the west side of Godstone Green. For those who wish to use public transport, we recommend that you catch a train to Redhill Station and we will arrange pick up from the station circa 10.00. Please let

Tony Barber or Lester Sonden know the arrival time of your train.

Distance: Distance approximately 4 miles before lunch in Tandridge and then another

2.5 miles back to Godstone.

Route: The route crosses Godstone Green and then heads south, steadily rising to

the Greensand Ridge at Tilburstow Hill. We then join the Greensand Way walking east with extensive views over Surrey and Sussex towards the South Downs. The path eventually leaves the ridge and crosses fields to the hamlet of Tandridge where we have lunch. After lunch we return to Godstone via Leigh Place, St Nicholas Church, Churchtown, and Bay Pond. Paths are reasonable, but can get muddy in places after rain. Shorts are not recommended due to some short sections being edged with nettles and

brambles.
